The Wadham Players Summer Open-Air Production of "Romeo and Juliet"

The Wadham Players traditionally perform a summer open-air show in July two unique locations.

This year they performed performed "Romeo and Juliet" by William Shakespeare. The first performance took place on Sunday 16th July 2006 in the unique surroundings of Barnsbury Wood, a scenic urban woodland in the heart of Islington, north London. After the first open-air performance in Islington they took the show to the open-air woodland theatre at Willow Cottage, Curtis Mill Green near Stapleford Abbots in Essex for three performances the following weekend on Saturday 22nd July 2006 in the afternoon, again on Saturday 22nd July in the evening, and a final performance on Sunday 23rd July 2006.

The contrast between the two locations is very apparent. Barnsbury Wood in Islington is a hidden woodland, yet is just yards from the shops, traffic, pubs, cafes, restaurants and bars of the Caledonian Road, with the easy public transport links of the Caledonian Road Underground station on the Piccadilly Line, Highbury and Islington station on the Victoria Line, or Caledonian Road and Barnsbury on

the Silverlink North London Line. On the other hand, Willow Cottage Open-Air Theatre is far more secluded. The theatre is a natural amphitheatre cut into a mud bank in 200 acres of woodland deep in the Essex countryside. The theatre is accessed using country tracks and it is about a mile to the nearest tarmacked road. Other than the few country pubs and villages a few miles away, audiences traditionally bring picnics for a day out. However the Wadham Players traditionally attract a large and loyal audience to Willow Cottage, which by all accounts, is an enchanting setting for a summer show.
